Thursday 6th December for Isabel Hospice

If you have a life-limiting illness, Isabel Hospice can care for you and your family.

All their care is free and can be provided in your home, at their Living Well community hubs or their



In-Patient Unit. They work alongside other healthcare providers and aim to increase the number of people they help over the next five years. Most patients have cancer, however, they are caring for more people with other life-limiting conditions.

They rely heavily on donations from our community, as well as income from fundraising events and from their 16 shops. This year the Hospice must raise around £5 million so that they can continue to care for more people, earlier in their journey.

Thursday 3rd January for Botswana Partnership Project for young people with diabetes, hosted by a local 18 year old

Next Easter, a group of diabetic teenagers including myself, and NHS staff will be travelling to Botswana to help young people with diabetes. Whilst there, I will be part of a diabetes camp where we will share experiences of growing up with type 1 diabetes with the young people of Botswana. Together we will learn more about management of diabetes and take part in team challenges. Following the camp, we will return to the capital, Gaborone, to help decorate the children's hospital.

The project requires me to raise £2500 by February 2019 to cover the cost of flights, accommodation and food, but also to contribute to the diabetes camp, and to take over much needed supplies and resources. To November, I've raised just over £1200 by organising a quiz, with a plan to do another; taken part in the National Three Peaks Challenge; and given presentations to tell people about my involvement. I still have much to raise, and hope this lunch will help me reach my goal.

Thursday 7th February for Battersea Dogs and Cats Home

From the moment they welcomed their first stray dog in 1860 they have been placing their animals at the centre of everything they do. More than three million



animals later, they're still working hard to achieve their vision that every dog and cat should live in a home where they are treated with love, care and respect. Their expenditure in 2017 was £34.8 million, resulting in £50,000 being invested every day to care for the dogs and cats at 3 centres.


1st Stanstead Abbotts & St Margaret's Scout Group

From the Vicar Revd Anne Donaldson



'Christmas is for the children' I still hear sometimes. I feel like joining the panto "O no it's not!" Sure Jesus did welcome children in a way revolutionary for His day (when Rabbis were not supposed to have anything to do with children) but Jesus didn't leave His heavenly comforts and glory just for children but for love of absolutely everyone — and that includes you, whatever you think of yourself, or whether you acknowledge Jesus or not — that's how amazing His love is.

Jesus was born for you, lived for you, taught for you, died for you, rose to life again for you, and sent His Holy Spirit for you. All because He loves you so much.

He could have stayed in heaven – He had no need to come to mankind at all. He came because of His great love. Greater love than we will ever be able to know or understand – far deeper, stronger, and less selfish than the best human love can ever be.

What makes me believe this? Because I read it in the Bible, and my experience of the Bible is that it is reliable – and because of my experience of God.

Experiencing God isn't because I'm a priest – I responded to God and obeyed His call to work for the Church because of my experience of His love. Remember what it felt like when you were first in love? It coloured everything about your life and brought it alive in a new way. That's how I felt when I first experienced God. My (non-religious) boss noticed it and asked me what had happened, and I described to him how 2 elderly ladies had asked if they could pray for me ('yeah, sure – whatever') and suddenly God was real eventhough I couldn't see Him. So real. My boss went out and bought doughnuts – 'have one of those' he urged. But I was coeliac and needed to keep to a gluten-free diet. 'You never know' he said. I ate one – and nothing happened!! The secretary went out at lunchtime and bought me a sandwich – nothing happened! I eventually went back to Barts hospital – 'you are in remission' they said, 'come back when it returns'. That was in 1978

I have experienced God many many times since, as have so many others in these villages. He is always there, but we often don't allow Him to get through to us. He longs to show us His love, and how hurt He must be that we don't give Him the space in our lives to do so.

He was born because He loves us so much. Please find the time in the hustle and bustle of Christmas and New Year to let Him show you that. See p21 and 14 for just a couple of ways to do so. Happy Christmas

More than 33,000 **social action projects** run or supported by churches, according to figures setting out for the first time the full scale of the Church of England's service to communities. The findings show that 80 per cent of congregations are involved in one or more forms of social action. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, said: "these figures spell out for the first time the sheer scale and range of our churches' commitment to their communities. We are doing more to love and help people in need than at any time since 1945. We don't just do this to be 'nice' but because our faith in Jesus Christ compels us to act."

Amongst many projects, data gathered shows that the biggest area of work is in food banks - with 60 per cent involved in either running or supporting food banks through volunteers, donations and providing venues.
